TITLE SUMMARY: Accept ARPA funding from the County of Riverside for the

Gateway Park Revitalization Project

#### Recommendation(s)

That the City Council and CSD:

- 1. Authorize the City Manager/Executive Director or Authorized Representative, Parks & Community Services Director or designee, to accept \$1,000,000 in ARPA funding from the County of Riverside for the Gateway Park Revitalization Project; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager/Executive Director to enter into an agreement with the County of Riverside and process the necessary budget adjustments/appropriations in FY 24/25 as outlined in the fiscal impact section of this report.

### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends approval of an agreement with the County of Riverside and acceptance of \$1,000,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding from the County of Riverside for the Gateway Park Revitalization Project. This project will fund the creation of a one-acre dog park utilizing existing open green space at Gateway Park.

ARPA funds will be utilized for the construction of the dog park. The City will utilize \$150,000 of DIF Park Improvement funds (Fund 2905) for planning, design and other administrative costs. The total anticipated cost for this project is \$1,150,000.

### **DISCUSSION**

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was signed into law, amending Section 9901 of Title VI of the Social Security Act which establishes the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (Fiscal Recovery Funds) to provide state, local and Tribal governments with the resources needed to respond to the pandemic and its economic effects and to build a stronger, more equitable economy during the recovery. In response to the negative effects which in turn affect our community, the County has dedicated a portion of the allotted ARPA funds to local agencies for the delivery and implementation of eligible neighborhood revitalization projects. The County has selected the Gateway Park Revitalization Project to receive \$1,000,000 in ARPA funding for the construction of this project.

The Gateway Park Revitalization Project will utilize existing open green space in Gateway Park to develop and create a dog park for large and small dogs. The dog playground will include a walking path with various surface types, play features, shade and seating. Additionally, this project will include installation of park lights, drinking fountains, a dog washing station area, secure perimeter fencing and mow curb, ADA accessible path of travel, site furnishings, and other amenities.

Funding for the construction of this project (\$1,000,000) will be funded in full from ARPA through an agreement with the County of Riverside. The City will utilize DIF Park Improvement funds (\$150,000) for the planning, design and administration of this project.

The anticipated completion date for this project is Summer of 2025. Upon Council approval, the City will execute an agreement with the County of Riverside and will provide all necessary reporting and documentation requested.

### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Approve and authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff recommend this alternative because it will allow the City to accept ARPA funds from the County to revitalize Gateway Park.
- 2. Do not approve and do not authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff does not recommend this alternative as it will not allow for the City to receive funding for revitalizing a Park.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Construction for this project will be funded by the County of Riverside ARPA funds (\$1,000,000). The planning, design and administration of this project will be funded by DIF Park Improvements (\$150,000). The ARPA funds will be budgeted in Other Grants (fund 2300) and the planning, design and administration will be budgeted in PCS Capital
