## Recommendation(s)

That the City Council:

1. Award a Highway Safety Improvement construction contract to Iteris, Inc. for the Traffic Signal Upgrades Project, City Project Number 808 0035; and

2. Authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with Iteris, Inc. in the amount of \$951,060, funded by the Capital Projects Grants Fund (Fund 2301) and State Gas Tax Fund (Fund 2000); and

3. Authorize the issuance of a Purchase Order to Iteris Inc. for the amount of \$981,060 (\$951,060 bid amount plus \$30,000 contingency) when the contract has been signed by all parties; and

4. Authorize the Public Works Director/City Engineer to execute any subsequent related change orders to the contract with Iteris, Inc. up the contingency amount, subject to the approval of the City Attorney.

## <u>SUMMARY</u>

This report recommends approval of a construction contract with Iteris, Inc. for the Traffic Signal Upgrades Project, City Project Number 808 0035, to provide traffic signal upgrade

improvements to approximately 50 intersections throughout the City. This project is funded by the Caltrans Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Grant. This work also complies with the City Council's Momentum MoVal Strategic Plan to manage and maximize Moreno Valley's public infrastructure through maintenance programs and capital improvements.

## **DISCUSSION**

The Caltrans Division of Local Assistance (DLA) manages California's local agency share of Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), aka Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), was signed into law by President Biden on November 15, 2021. Under IIJA, HSIP is a core federal aid program that helps states significantly reduce fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads. California's Local HSIP focuses on infrastructure projects with nationally recognized crash reduction factors (CRFs). Additionally, Local HSIP projects must be identified based on crash experience, crash potential, crash rate, or other data-supported means.

On March 13, 2023, Caltrans awarded the City of Moreno Valley, Traffic Signal Upgrade Project, \$982,710 with a local match requirement of \$109,190. The total amount approved for this project was \$1,091,900. In alignment with the Local HISP goals, this project aims to enhance the safety and efficiency of our roads by making improvements to approximately 50 intersections throughout the City. The improvements will include upgraded signal hardware, including lenses, and back-plates with retro-reflective borders, as well as upgrades to mounting, size, and number. The initial design phase, for which Caltrans allocated \$45,000, has been completed. For the construction phase of the project, Caltrans allocated \$937,710 on April 3, 2024.

The Project was advertised for construction bids on July 3, 2024, and formal bidding procedures have been followed in conformance with the Public Contract Code. Bids were received via the electronic bid management system, OpenGov.com, on August 1, 2024. A total of ten (10) bids were received. Iteris, Inc. was the lowest qualified bidder at \$836,785, with the Bid Schedule B of \$114,275 for a total amount of \$951,060.

## ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Approve and authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. This alternative will provide for the timely construction of Traffic Signal Upgrades Project. *Staff recommends this alternative.*
- 2. Do not approve and authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. *Staff does not recommend this alternative as it will result in returning State Funds of \$937,710.*

## FISCAL IMPACT

The construction contract is funded by the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Grant and is included in the adopted Fiscal Year 2023/24 & 2024/25 Capital Improvement

Plan (CIP). The available budget is allocated to the Capital Projects Grants Fund (2301) and State Gas Tax Fund (2000). There is no impact to the General Fund.
