L.1.3 Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC)

The Commission adopted the resolution authorizing prepayment of the 2017 United States Department of Transportation, Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation loan for I-15 Express Lanes Project in the amount of \$173,747,433.

The Commission heard a presentation of the Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure update.

L.1.4 Riverside Transit Agency Board of Directors (RTA)

Mayor Pro Tem Barnard reported the following:

In 2000, RTA implemented Oracle eBusiness Suite as its core software. In order for RTA to maintain Premier Support from Oracle, the current environment will need to be upgraded to the latest version. The Committee approved to authorize staff to award an agreement to Datavail Corporation to upgrade the application system and database in the amount of \$284,375.

L.1.5 Western Riverside Council of Governments Executive Committee (WRCOG)

Councilmember Baca-Santa Cruz reported the following:

At the WRCOG Executive Committee meeting on October 7, 2024, reports for Fiscal Department Activities, Committees and Agency Activities, Various (external) Committees, I-REN Monthly Activities,

Love Your Neighborhood Program Update, and Regional Streetlight Program Activities were received and filed.

Additionally, staff recommendations were approved for the following:

- Annual PACE Unclaimed HERO Refunds Escheatment Update
- Policy Setting Parameters for Adding Agencies to the WRCOG Structure

The Executive Committee also discussed the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and California Energy Commission (CEC) Advanced Technology Demonstration and Pilot Program Grant. Moreno Valley received \$635,679 in grant funding, which will be used to deploy two plug-in electric vehicles (a street sweeper and a dump truck) and three charging stations (two mobile and one DC fast charger).
