L.1 REGIONAL COMMISSION/COMMITTEE/BOARD

L.1.1 March Joint Powers Commission (JPC)

Councilmember Delgado reported the following:

The Commission awarded a contract for the demolition of Building 962 (former Dining Hall) and Building 976 (former Dormitory/722 LGS). Both Buildings have become public nuisances with regular break-ins and fires. Demolition is anticipated to commence by the end of the month, depending on weather conditions.

The Commission also awarded a contract for the March Inland Port Apron Reconstruction Project. This project will reconstruct Pavement Management Areas 14 and 15, better accommodating existing Group V aircraft.

L.1.2 Riverside County Habitat Conservation Agency Board of Directors (RCHCA)

Councilmember Gonzalez reported the following:

At the RCHCA Board of Directors meeting on February 13, 2025, the activity reports for Agency Attendance Roster, Stephens' Kangaroo Rat (SKR) Fee Transfers from Member Agencies, Financial Report through December 2024, Contracts and Grants Status Updates, Recovery and Reserve Management and Monitoring Efforts, Reserve Management for the Southwestern Riverside County Multi-Species/Lake Mattews Reserves, Reserve Management Coordinating Committee, SKR Recovery Efforts, Educational Outreach Program Activities, and SKR Reserve Management and Monitoring Efforts were received and filed.

Additionally, staff recommendations were approved for the following:

- Amendment to the Agreement between RCHCA and Southern California Gas Company Regarding Incidental Take Authorization for the Stephens' Kangaroo Rat for the L1028 Hydrostatic Test Project
- Election of Leadership for Calendar Year 2025

The RCHCA Board of Directors Voting Bylaws were tabled for a future RCHCA Board of Directors Meeting.

L.1.4 Riverside Transit Agency Board of Directors (RTA)

The Committee approved to authorize staff to award an agreement to Motive Energy Storage Systems, LLC. for the design/build of a solar photovoltaic (PV) system for a total project amount of \$2,761,587.

L.1.5 Western Riverside Council of Governments Executive Committee (WRCOG)

Councilmember Delgado reported the following:

- The Commission awarded a contract for the demolition of Building 962 (former Dining Hall) and Building 976 (former Dormitory/722 LGS). Both Buildings have become public nuisances with regular break-ins and fires. Demolition is anticipated to commence by the end of the month, depending on weather conditions.
- The Commission also awarded a contract for the March Inland Port Apron Reconstruction Project. This project will reconstruct Pavement Management Areas 14 and 15, better accommodating existing Group V aircraft.

L.1.6 Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Authority Board of Directors (RCA)

Mayor Pro Tem Baca-Santa Cruz reported the following:

At the WRCOG Executive Committee meeting on February 3, 2025, reports for Fiscal Department Activities, Committees and Agency Activities, and Various (external) Committees were received and filed. Staff recommendations were approved for the following:

- Approval of a Professional Services Agreement for On-Call Planning Services with Iteris and First Amendments to Professional Services Agreements for On-Call Planning Services with Fehr & Peers and Michael Baker International, Inc.
- TUMF Program agreements for two reimbursements and four reimbursement amendments.

- Appointment of WRCOG Representatives to Various Outside Committees for the period of January 1, 2025 and ending December 31, 2026.

Additionally, there were four items on the Agenda that included some discussion, following are the summaries:

1. Authorization to Purchase Real Property Located at 1955 Chicago Avenue, Riverside
 - WRCOG is currently engaged in a process to potentially acquire this building. The due diligence process for this purchase is currently scheduled to close after the March 3, 2025, meeting.
 - The due diligence process includes inspections, surveys, appraisals, and other related items.
 - The Executive Committee authorized the Executive Director to purchase the subject property with a not-to-exceed amount of \$7M, which includes both the building and associated due diligence.
2. Recap and Summary of the January 10, 2025, Strategic Planning Session
 - Members of the Executive Committee, member agency staff, and WRCOG staff met on January 10, 2025, to review the WRCOG strategic plan.
 - This meeting reviewed accomplishments and discussed key issues and areas of focus for WRCOG in 2025.
3. I-REN Energy Workforce Gaps Assessment and MOUs with Riverside and San Bernardino Counties' Workforce Development Departments
 - Between February and November 2024, I-REN developed an Energy workforce Gaps Assessment to analyze energy workforce gaps, employer needs, and existing training opportunities in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.
 - Findings include that energy-related occupations in the subregion are projected to grow by an average of 20% by 2030. The same energy-related occupations are expected to

see a 25% retirement and 57% transfer rate as well between 2020 – 2030.

- The findings and key recommendations were presented to and prioritized by the I-REN workforce roundtables as well as the I-REN Executive Committee prior to presentation to the WRCOG Executive Committee as such:
 - Strengthen collaboration between employers and workforce development organizations to assess training effectiveness.
 - Strengthen the regional education and training pipeline from K-12 to energy employment.
 - Connect job seekers to training providers.
 - Provide support services to make training and certification more attainable.
 - The Executive Committee approved action to work with both Counties' Workforce Development Departments to support the development and deployment of energy efficiency workforce programs that are guided by the recommendations outlined in the I-REN Energy Workforce Gaps Assessment.
4. Member Dues Exploration
- Member dues are paid by each WRCOG member agency and used to support agency functions. Dues have not been increased since 2008 and WRCOG programs have had to bear an increasing amount of overall agency costs.
 - The TAC and Administration & Finance Committee recommended that the Executive Committee adjust the member dues based on historical CPI and use the CPI to index member dues in the future.
