Design Competition Program Parameters And Timeline

## Recommendation(s)

That the City Council:

- 1. Receive an update on the City flag design competition program parameters and timeline; and
- 2. Provide direction as necessary.

#### **SUMMARY**

On December 3, 2024, the City Council approved the Environmental and Historical Preservation Commission to proceed with developing a new City flag design competition. Subsequently, City Council directed the Commission to bring back program parameters for review and approval.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Environmental and Historical Preservation Commission have prepared program parameters for a new City flag design competition and developed a proposed timeline.

The EHPC proposes the theme of the contest to be: "Having pride for our City's past, present, and future."

### Program Details:

- Flag proposals must be in good taste and reflect the culture and heritage of Moreno Valley.
- Flag proposals are encouraged to reflect the City's motto, "Where Dreams Soar."
- Simplicity: The flag design should be simple enough for a child to draw from memory.
- Symbolism: The flag's colors, images, or patterns should relate to the overall theme of the contest.
- Colors: The flag should use no more than two or three basic colors that contrast well
- Lettering: The flag should not use writing of any kind, however, if writing is necessary for artistic purposes, it should be kept to a minimum.
- Seals and Imagery: The flag proposal should avoid the use of an organization or government seal, as well as "trademarked" or copyrighted images.
- Uniqueness: The flag should avoid duplicating other flags, as well as political symbolism, but use similarities to showcase cultural and regional connections.
- Designs must be submitted to EHPC in person with contact information or email via PDF, PNG, or JPEG for consideration.
- Open solely to all Moreno Valley residents of all ages. (EHPC recommends verification of residency confirmed via City Clerk's office or EHPC.)
- Resident students may be from Moreno Valley Charter Schools, Moreno Valley Unified School District, Val Verde Unified School District, or Moreno Valley College schools. Students are strongly encouraged to participate.
- Minors under the age of 18 would require a waiver to participate in the redesign contest.

#### Timeframe and Contest Outcome:

- Submission period would be open for 60 days to ensure adequate participation from all four City Council Districts.
- If the number of submissions received by the EHPC is deemed inadequate, the timeframe of the contest could be extended by the Commission via 30day increments.
- Once submission period is concluded, EHPC members will discuss and possibly take action to select the top 3 proposals for final consideration by the City Council.
- The City Council will determine when the redesigned flag shall be unveiled. Recommended dates include:
  - June 14 Flag Day;
  - December 3 City's Birthday; or

• Other date deemed suitable by the City Council.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Approve the proposed program parameters as presented by the EHPC.
- 2. Provide further direction on potential program parameters.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There are no fiscal impacts from approving the proposed new City flag design competition.
