DUAL ENROLLMENT



Dual Enrollment College Courses: Transferable college courses taught right on our campuses, and for our students, they are absolutely free.

They can earn college credit *before* high school graduation.

By successfully completing college courses, students are counted as prepared on the California Department of Education's Dashboard College/Career Indicator.

Moreno Valley Unified School District was awarded the California School Board Association's Golden Bell for Dual Enrollment programs and expansions.

DUAL ENROLLMENT



- ★ We have partnered with CSUSB, MVC and NEON
- ★ We offer over 38 sections each semester; serving over 940 students a semester
- ★ For 25-26 school year, over 1800 students will be enrolled a dual enrollment course earning approximately 5,400 college units
- ★ \$42 a unit at community college = \$226,800 in saving

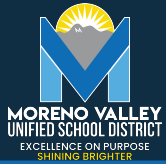

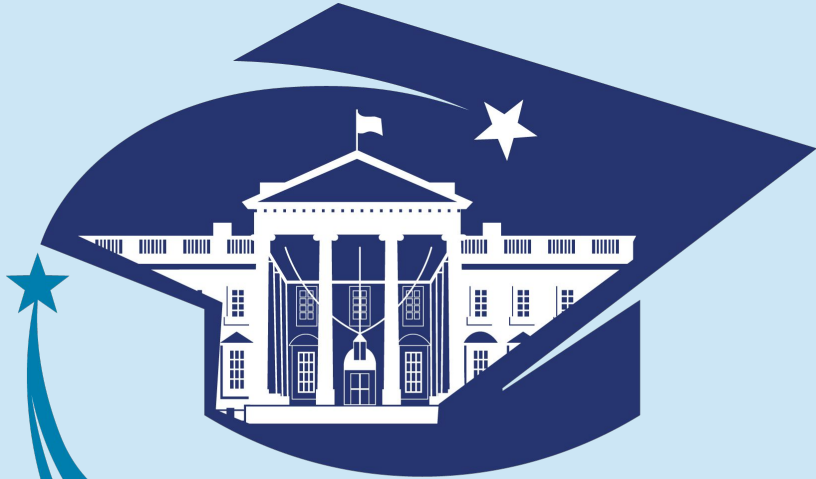
EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL EXPANSION PLAN AT VISTA DEL LAGO HIGH

SCHOOL

- An Early College High School Academy focused on students earning a minimum of 30 transferable credits and working towards the Cal-Getc
- The Cal-GETC is a **general education pathway** for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill their lower-division general education (GE) requirements necessary for transfer to the CSU and UC systems.

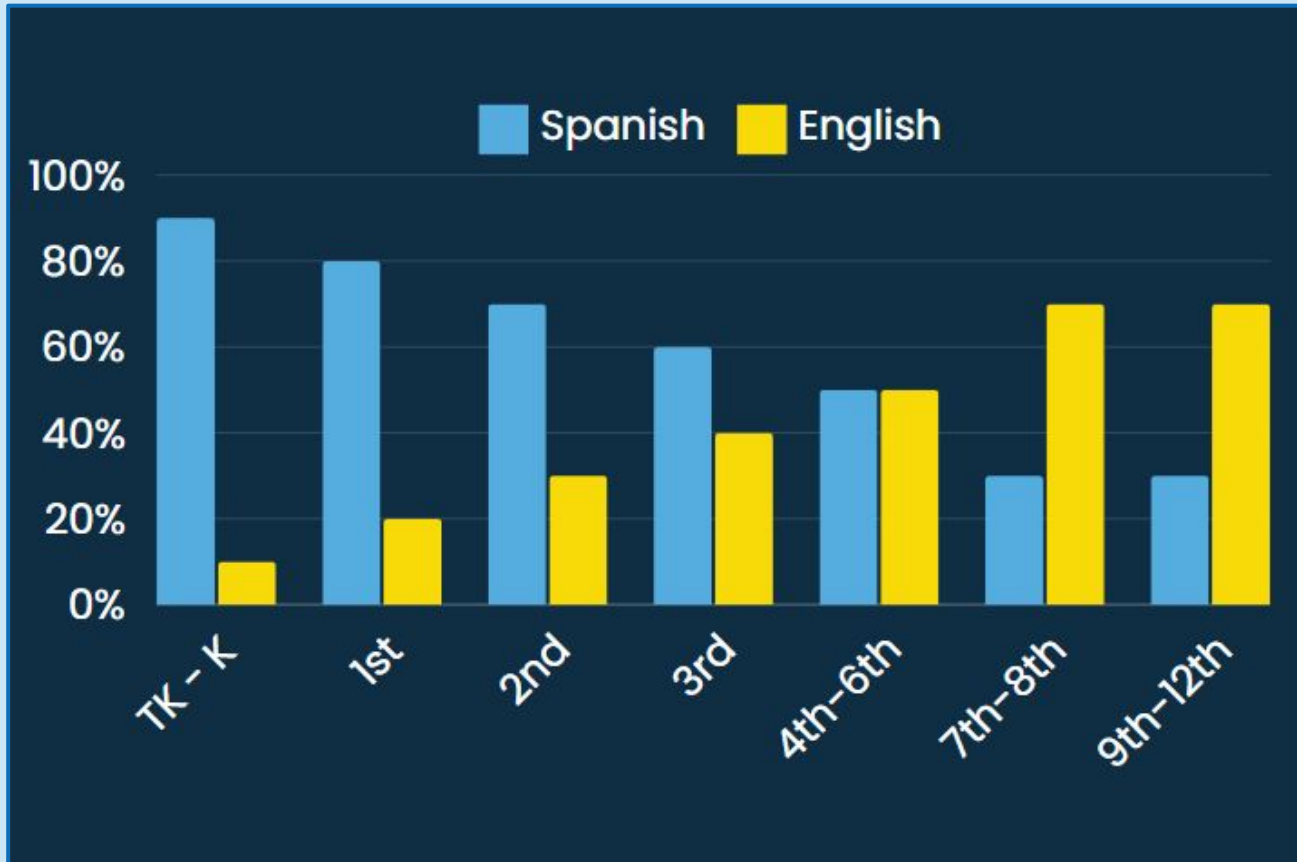

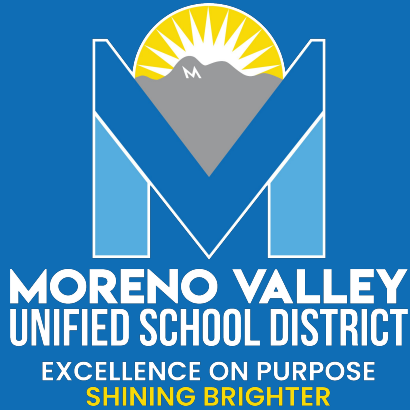
