Recommendation(s)

That the City Council:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2026-xx Appointing a City Treasurer.

SUMMARY

California Government Code Section 34856 provides that when the office of the City Treasurer is made appointive, the appointment shall be made by the City Council. Due to the vacancy of the Chief Financial Officer, Launa Jimenez has been acting in the Chief Financial Officer capacity since she oversees these functions as part of her normal role as Assistant City Manager (Administration), which the Council appointed her to City Treasurer on December 16, 2025. The successful open recruitment of a new Chief Financial Officer necessitates a new Treasurer to be appointed.

DISCUSSION

Since the incorporation of the City, the Chief Financial Officer (or Finance Director) also held the title and responsibility of City Treasurer. After a successful open recruitment, the City Manager has appointed Felicia London to the position of Chief Financial Officer.

Therefore, it is appropriate at this time for the City Council to adopt the proposed resolution appointing her as City Treasurer.

ALTERNATIVES

1. Adopt the proposed resolution appointing Felicia London as City Treasurer effective immediately. *Staff recommends this alternative to ensure that the duties and responsibilities of the Treasurer position continue to be achieved.*
2. Do not adopt the proposed resolution and provide staff with further direction.
